Broadmoor Sirens - You'll be familiar with the sound of the Broadmoor Hospital siren, which is tested every Monday morning at 10am. There are 13 sirens, introduced in 1952 following an escape, covering Sandhurst, Wokingham, Bracknell, Camberley and Bagshot. In 2014 a review and public consultation about partial decommissioning of the siren system took place. From 2018 a single siren will be located in the grounds of the hospital. All remaining sirens will then be decommissioned.
